I can't believe how fast time seems to be going !! We ended last year with a very wet Spring which brought plenty of flooding to the rivers but a very dry lead up to Christmas with early hatches of cicadas. This flooding should be a good thing in terms of reducing the trout population naturally to bring the food to trout ratio back more in line. As we headed into November we started to get some good evening rises for the dry fly fishermen but this was a bit up and down with the rain and flooding. The Mayflies started off being quite good but got a little knocked around due to the flooding. The caddis came on line with some good sport to be had at the change of light. These were mostly recovering rainbows but quite interesting a few nice browns as well. During this period there were also plenty of green beetle around and anglers this year had a bit of fun using the green beetle dries.

The fishing in Lake Taupo seemed to be quite good over the Spring and lead up to Christmas, however over the Christmas and New Year period (especially on the Western shore of Pukawa and Kuratau) appeared to be quite difficult as reported by holidaymakers. The lake reached it's maximum operating level late in the Spring and had started to go down over the xmas break. This may have had some effect on what was happening. Just recently with the big flood in the Tongariro this level has gone over the maximum level once again. There were not many reports of smelt around this time but upon visiting the tailrace to crew a yacht over most of January there was plenty of smelt hanging around the marina area, also the odd report of big smelt as well. This tells me that things in the lake may have changed from "normal – whatever normal is" and that the food could be in other areas. There were two good floods over this period in the rivers as well which may have altered things once again. There were some good reports from river mouth anglers of some BIG koura at the mouths. Another good report from a boatie over this period said that it took him a while to find the fish but once he did he had some of the best quality fish that he has had for about 5 years reporting rainbows 500mm long and being described as "fat barrels". This is a good sign for the river anglers to come for the forthcoming winter.

As I am writing this we have just had a big flood in the Tongariro around 650 cumecs. The week or two prior to this flood some very nice browns around 5-9lbs were being caught. The flood being reasonably large fell short of the 1998 flood (800 cumecs) and the 2004 flood (1450 cumecs). Upon inspection of the river it looks to have maintained its course reasonably well with a few minor adjustments and has made the river appear "nicer". Plenty of mud / dirt was moved in the flood and a few more minor flushes would be good to get this soft stuff away from the margins of the water. Care needs to be taken wading due to the fact that you might "sink" into this soft stuff. Browns were caught two days after the flood and appears to have moved a few fish around. Hopefully the river will settle in the next few weeks and we may still get some cicada action for the browns yet around the town pools. This flood should have pushed a lot of juvenile fish back to Lake Taupo to begin their growth cycle and I would expect in the next few weeks boating anglers to start catching quite a few juvenile trout around 6-8 inches (15-20cm).

With all of the rain Lake Otamangakau has been up and down like a yo-yo as well. Just recently I have seen some pictures of some nice conditioned fish with some anglers doing reasonably well. Some nice plump fish reported. Also just recently this has exceeded the maximum level and looks to be held high to allow the Waikato Catchment and Lake Taupo to drain before they are able to release water from here. This may warm the lake up. Plenty of anglers have been heading that way and this fishery continues to be popular.

All in all an exciting Spring and Summer and the river anglers should wait with anticipation to see what happens in the rivers in the next few months. All being ok – with anglers reporting much better conditioned fish last year, we should see this continue into this year.

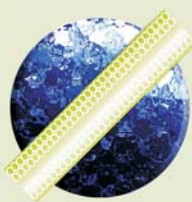

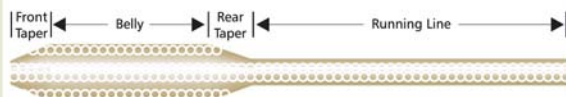
