## Mack Butts

8 September 1925 – 30 December 2012

Joined TALTAC 1965

Appointed Honorary Auditor 1998: Honorary Reviewer 2000

Made an Honorary Life Member 2011

Thomas McDougall Drury Butts was born in Wellington. Four years later, after his father retired, the family moved to Jersey in the Channel Islands. It was there that he began a lifelong commitment to sport, playing soccer and athletics at both of which from an early age he began to excel. He also started to fish, for sprats off the wharf. The family returned to Auckland in 1936 and the next year Mack started at Auckland Grammar School where he played soccer for the school in all age groups and for his club, Metro College. From 1938 he won the school steeplechase for his age group every year until he left. In the summers Mack played tennis at Royal Oak and later Eden & Epsom tennis clubs and while still a teenager became secretary of the latter. Throughout Mack's life there is a theme of commitment to the welfare of the organisations to which he belonged as he took on roles

to contribute. The presidencies of Rotary and Probus are just two examples.

After qualifying as an accountant in 1944 Mack volunteered to join the RNZAF and trained to become a pilot spending the last years of the war at Whenuapai Air Base. With the war over he returned to accounting and his first love, soccer. In 1947 he was selected to play for Auckland, the team won the Chatham Cup in 1950; he was made captain in 1951. Simultaneously he was selected to captain the New Zealand team and they beat Victoria, Australia at the Basin Reserve.

In 1950 Mack married Val and soon their growing family, eventually of four daughters, Sarah, Deborah, Rebecca and Charlotte, caused sport to share life with family but tennis, harriers and soccer continued to play their part. In 1953 the family moved from Kohimarama to Cambridge where Mack set up an accounting partnership. There he played soccer and tennis and took up golf in which he soon had a single figure handicap.

In 1955 they returned to Auckland to further the girls' education. Mack went into partnership in Titirangi where the family settled and he found squash, a game he could play in his lunch hour! The family joined the Titirangi Tennis Club.

It was at this time that Mack became keen on trout fishing. Val and the girls loved skiing but the call of the rivers was too strong and he fished sometimes alone but more often with friends or his daughters. On one occasion he and Rebecca spent a cold winter's night in a station wagon by the Tongariro River and early the next morning pulled themselves across the river on the frozen rope of the Red Hut Pool flying fox. At TALTAC he and Brad Lambert became friends and would team up for a day's fishing. Mack claimed not to be a great angler but loved the sport for the number of beautiful parts of New Zealand that it took him to, the friends that he met and the anticipated thrill of hooking and playing a good fish.

Sadly Mack and Val couldn't make it together and eventually divorced. Some years later he met and married June who also had her own family. They were to have thirty-eight very happy and harmonious years together in their idyllic home in Epsom. They went on many holidays in campervans, caravans and touring with a tent and were sometimes joined by their children and grandchildren. Family members would join Mack at TALTAC and he has been instrumental in introducing a number of them and other young people to the sport.

Never slow to shoulder a burden for others Mack agreed to become honorary auditor for TALTAC, for legal reasons the title was later changed to reviewer. Mary Nisbet and John Billings can vouch for his meticulous attention to detail, (Mack called it pedantic but he was alone in that). Twice every January he would come to TALTAC to run through the accounts. Mary especially felt the benefit of his knowledge and expertise. Eventually the three of them had the accounts so well organised that the visits were reduced to one and then none as they were checked and approved by email.

A committed family man, an avid and talented sportsman, Mack contributed much to many people and organisations; he ran a fine race.

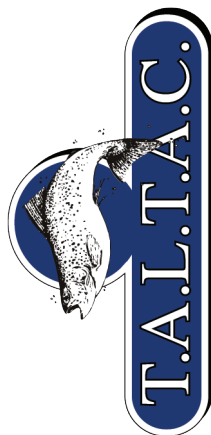

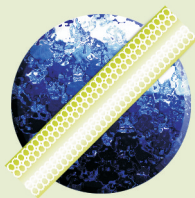

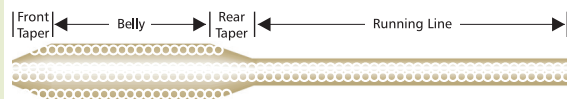
